Last night we had our monthly meeting.

Sometimes when there are big emotions, when things feel a little off, or when you're not quite sure what's happening beneath the surface, the best thing you can do is take the temperature. Pause. Listen. Ask what's working well and what we need to keep doing to sustain the momentum we've built.

That's exactly what we did.

We took the temperature—and what we heard was reassuring. People shared how much this space matters to them. How important it is to know they're not alone, not operating in their own little silo. There was appreciation for the speakers who come in to inform and educate us, and for how that knowledge helps us go back out and better serve and educate our community—always rooted in our mission.

One thing is clear, though: we still have work to do.

Nearly a year into this, there are people right here in our community who still haven't heard about RID United—who don't know this space exists. People shared, repeatedly, how important the existence of this space is for them, and that tells us we need to think more intentionally about how to reach those who share the same concerns we do about MAGA but haven't yet found their way here.

So, here's our ask:

If you're reading this, think of five people you could tell about these monthly meetings. Five people you could share our mission with. Five people who might be looking for connection, information, and a way to push back against MAGA, which is actively hurting and harming our neighbors and our friends.

Five people who are Republicans, Independents, and Democrats – because we share the belief that MAGA does not represent the United States. A country built on pluralism – where different beliefs, identities, and voices coexist. A country grounded in freedom. A country that celebrates diversity. MAGA actively works as the antithesis to the very foundations that truly make our country great.

Momentum matters. Community matters. And nights like last night remind us why we keep showing up.
