Gerrymandering and Redistricting

Congressional should be redrawn after a census (in 2030), but due to political pressure, states are doing it now, as in Texas and California. Ohio's redistricting is ongoing, as ordered by the state Supreme Court, who ruled the current map unconstitutional.

Prepare for the primary election on May 5, 2026, and the general election on November 3, 2026.

Gerrymandering and Redistricting – Carol Roe's Notes

1 - Historical Context

- 1812 – Massachusetts Governor Elbridge Gerry signs a district plan favoring his party; one district resembles a salamander. “Gerry-mander.”
- 19th/20th centuries – Widely used to secure partisan control and marginalize minority communities.
- Today: Still used to manipulate elections, protect incumbents, and weaken opposition despite reform and court challenges.
- National picture: Texas, California, Louisiana, Indiana.

3 - More Recent Ohio Redistricting

- September 30: Ohio General Assembly had until September 30, 2025, to hold hearings and vote on a bipartisan map.
- October 31: Redistricting Commission had until October 31 to hold hearings and vote on a bipartisan map.
- November 30: The General Assembly had until November 30 to hold hearings and vote on a bipartisan or party line map.
- Last Resort: Governor signs or vetoes the map passed by the General Assembly.
